MARINES WIN EASILY. Take Game Devoid of Features from the Nescos by 15 to 7. The Marines easily defeated the National Electrical Supply Company in the first game of the double header at National Park yesterday by the overwhelming score of 15 to 7.

It was given out yesterday that the Nationals have obtained the services of Bill Gray, the star twirler of the Los Angeles team, in the Pacific Coast League.

The first game was devoid of features, each team playing fast, snappy ball. The Marines, after the fifth inning, connected with the ball hard and drove it to all corners of the park for a total of sixteen hits.

Gray, who goes by the sobriquet of Dolly, is a left hander and a big man physically. He is described as having great speed and a better break to his fast and curve balls than Bill Burns, who played with Gray before coming East.
