NEW LOW PRICES FOR YEAR

Extraordinary improvement in condition of New York banks—Increase of \$14,500,000 in cash is shown—American Smelting and Refining holds well after break.

New York, July 23.—Features of the markets to-day, as on Thursday and yesterday, were the costly liquidation in the stock market and the extraordinary improvement in the condition of the New York banks.

Closing prices were at or close to the low level of the day, and most of the active stocks sold at new low prices for the year.

The banks showed an increase of \$14,500,000 in surplus reserve, a decrease of \$87,000 in loans and an increase of \$46,000,000 in cash.
