MEANING OF ZIONIST MOVEMENT

Object to Re-establish Jerusalem Interests Millions of Followers of the Late Dr. Herzl.

I have had several letters asking if I would not plainly set forth in one of my letters to The Washington Herald the meaning of Zionism, of which such frequent mention is made in the daily papers. It is a simple matter to give the story, to tell of the inception and progress of the movement that comes under that name, but to know the causes that led up to it one must study the history of the Jews.

"Zionist students," reads Mr. Zangwill's account of his death, "watched day and night over his body, and a great weeping procession, recruited from many lands, bore him to the home, which he hoped would not be the last. For his will directs that when the Jewish people makes its way to Palestine his bones shall be borne with it." To those who know him only through what he did and wrote he will always remain an inspired figure, "towering like Saul above his brethren with the face of the old Assyrian Kings on his features."

Ghetto and "The Melting Pot," have taught us much about our Jewish neighbors; taught us, in a measure, to understand and to sympathize with their isolation; taught us to feel for those orthodox Jews forced by cruel conditions in the land where they lived to seek asylums in this country, who must look on and see their children slipping away from the faith of their fathers. But still the Jews are strangers to us; strangers, perhaps, because they will it so and refuse to lay aside their splendid and dignified reserve.
