BROKER DISCUSSES CURRENT POLITICS

Thinks Democracy Might Swing Into Power.

CONDITIONS HURT BUSINESS

Commenting Upon Insurgency Fight in Republican Ranks, He Urges Rival Organization to Adopt Common Sense Issues—Anti-trust Act and Currency Demand Attention.

Wall street is the center of more information probably than any one of the great New York daily newspapers.

Everything that may affect stocks comes accurately and promptly to Wall street. Anything which may offer good returns upon invested capital is usually known there first of all.

Occasionally some of the writers employed in the street to provide information to the outside world, represented in the commission and correspondence houses of brokers and bankers, take a hand at politics or some other serious subject which has only an incidental bearing upon stocks and bonds.

Broker Writes Politics. Yesterday such a letter came to the office of A. G. Plant & Co. from the New York house which it represents.

"We are getting reports from one State after another giving the results of the contest between the insurgents and the regulars. Each side has a number of victories on its score, and the Republican party is evidently badly rent, if not torn asunder.

"The battles thus far are led by the followers, as neither of the great leaders, Taft and Roosevelt, has taken a hand, and both appear to be on a friendly footing. How long this can last with the bitterness and hissing going on at some of the conventions is a question.

"All these conditions are hopeful signs for people of common sense in both parties, and if the Democracy would now take up sane, common sense issues, it would find itself upheld by the great army of business people, who, after all, do the thinking that accomplishes things, and it could rely for support upon the great army of working men and railroad employees, who do the work that counts in the nation's progress.

"The Democratic party is logically fitted to take up actively the great issues which are waiting for intelligent adoption and leadership. These are, first of all, reform of the currency.

"The Republican party is responsible for the present anomalous and dangerous condition of the currency. Nearly fifty years ago it adopted the system which has been in use ever since, and which is absolutely unsound and heterogeneous.

"The amendment of the Sherman anti-trust act is another crying need of the times. The Republican party is responsible for this act which threatens to-day to disrupt the delicate organization of business.

"A sound Democratic party could well stand for amendment of the act in the interest of the wage-earners of the whole country, discarding the dangerous features and retaining provisions for honest regulation of monopoly.

"Here, then, are the two greatest issues before the country, neglected by the party in power, which is conducting a Kilkenny campaign in its own ranks, ostensibly on the issue of conservation of forests and water powers, but really much of the trouble has been fomented by the followers of Roosevelt, who want their old offices and the power that went with them.
