OVER 60 PER CENT OF WORLD'S OIL

Use of Oil Fuel Increasing on Railroads and Navy.

In 1907 the oil product of the United States, which had been increasing rapidly in previous years, made a phenomenal gain—over 30 per cent—and reached the great total of 166,955,335 barrels.

Bank of the States. Only three States contributed greatly to the increase in quantity produced. California took first place by gaining 21.5 per cent, Oklahoma increased 4.5 per cent, and West Virginia 12.8 per cent.

Fuel Oil on the Railroads. The use of fuel oil by the railroads of the United States is on the increase, the consumption in 1909 amounting to 19,939,231 barrels, as compared with 16,589,709 barrels in 1908.

Fuel Oil in the Navy. The introduction of fuel oil in the United States navy has been rapid, and the results have been fully as good as had been expected.

World's Product. The following countries besides the United States increased their production of oil in the year 1909: Russia, Galicia, Dutch East Indies, Roumania, Iran, and Peru.
