WEATHER CONDITIONS. U. S. Dept. of Agriculture, Weather Bureau, Washington, Wednesday, Jan. 4, 1911. The disturbance that covered the Atlantic seaboard, and extended rapidly northeastward and has disappeared beyond the field of observation, was followed during Wednesday by fair and moderate weather in the Eastern and Southeastern States, and during Wednesday morning the temperature was at low as 18 degrees in Northwestern Indiana and 22 degrees in Jacksonville, Fla. It was 2 degrees below zero at Corvath, Miss., and below zero in Northern New England and extreme Northwest.

FORMERLY A PASTOR HERE. Dr. D. W. Faunce, Who Died Tuesday, Was Well Known in Capital. Rev. David W. Faunce, who died Tuesday at Providence, R. I., on the eighty-second anniversary of his birth, was a former well-known Baptist minister of this city. He was the father of President Woodrow Wilson, of Brown University, and a former minister of Westchester, Mass. During his residence in Washington, Rev. Dr. Faunce was pastor of the old E. Street Baptist Church, from 1811 to 1889, preceding the pastor of the Temple Baptist Church, Rev. J. J. Muir. The former property was sold and the congregation located at Tenth and N streets northwest under the latter name. During his pastorate in this city Mr. Faunce was a leader in the church, and for years was active in missionary work.

SHAW INCREASE IN CENSUS. California and North Carolina Cities Gain in Population. Figures on cities having a population of 5,000 and more in California and North Carolina, which were given out by the Census Bureau yesterday, show some striking increases. Bakerfield, Cal., which in 1900 had a population of 4,500, in 1910 has 12,777; Fresno, 1900 14,800, 1910 24,670; Eureka, 1900 11,845, 1910 22,727; Riverside, 1900 13,212, 1910 27,973; Santa Cruz, 1910 11,140, 1900 5,659; San Bernardino, 1900 12,778, 1910 4,190. Raleigh, N. C., in 1900 had a population of 12,218, in 1910 16,428. Numerous other cities in both States of 5,000 or more population showed correspondingly large increases.
