

ROBBER, ROUTED BY MAID, CAUGHT BY A POLICEMAN

Detected on Third Floor of Minister's House.

GIVES UP HIS REVOLVER

Detected rifling a closet on the third floor of the residence of Rev. John Van Schack, pastor of the Church of Our Father, at 1417 Massachusetts avenue northwest, a forger, supposed to be the same man found hiding in the basement of Bishop Harding's residence Friday afternoon, was captured after a chase of several blocks by Policeman Boyle of the Second precinct, yesterday afternoon.

TAKES PISTOL AWAY. Ordering the man to "throw up his hands," Boyle leaped from his bicycle at Thomas Circle and, passing his hand to the rear pocket of the forger, drew therefrom a revolver and a quantity of cartridges. When searched at the police station, a gold watch and a gunmetal timepiece were found in the man's pockets. The prisoner at first refused to tell his police name. He speaks only a few words of English. He was later given a pencil and wrote his name as Joe Prochaska. He says he is from Pittsburgh, and that he spent several days in Baltimore before coming to this city. With the arrest of the forger, the police believe they have made an important capture. The fact that he was armed and had already entered two houses to their knowledge within the past two days in one of the most exclusive sections of the city verifies this theory, the police say, and probably will be the means of solving numerous other house-breaking cases.

Every Local Catholic Society to Participate.


HALTIGAN IS GRAND MARSHAL
