### "NOT OUR FRIEND," HE SAYS.

Burlison Denounced by M. I. Weller  
at Citizens' Meeting.

Representative Burlison, of Texas, member of the House District Committee, was denounced by M. I. Weller at the monthly meeting of the East Washington Citizens' Association last night.

A motion by Charles A. Rhoads that the association extend its thanks to Mr. Burlison for being instrumental in the withdrawal of twenty policemen from the White House brought Mr. Weller to his feet in protest.

"I do not think it fitting that this association should go on record as thanking him or any one else for doing that duty," said Mr. Weller. "Burlison has never been a friend of this organization, and how it can consistently thank him is more than I can understand."

### LABOR UNIONS TO ACT.

Object to Gas Companies Competing  
with Merchants.

It is likely the Central Labor Union will soon take active steps to prevent the gas companies from selling gas ranges in violation of their charters. At a meeting last night the matter was discussed in detail. The union objects to the companies competing with the merchants of the city.

## NAVY MACHINISTS GAIN A POINT

High-grade Workers at Local Yard  
Hereafter Will Receive \$4 a  
Day as Wages.

Higher wages were put within the reach of a portion of the machinists at the Washington Navy Yard by a decision rendered yesterday by Assistant Secretary of the Navy Whitthrop. The request of the machinists for a general increase of pay was refused, but instead, it was decided that a portion of the men, engaged on high-grade work, be paid the highest rate, \$4 a day, at present confined to a very few men. Added compensation was granted just because of the greater cost of living in Washington. The Navy Department gave out a statement, which follows in part: "The percentage of the total number of Washington Navy Yard receiving the highest rate of pay is abnormally great, approximating 62 per cent of the total number of machinists employed. This percentage is far greater than the percentage in any civil establishment comparable to any extent to the Washington yard."

"The department believes that the raising of machinists by classes having been abolished, and from the fact that certain machinists at the yard are undoubtedly doing specialized work of a high character, it would be justified in authorizing the promotion to this pay of a certain number of machinists who are now practically continuously engaged in such special work."

"This promotion will be made from time to time by the commandant until there shall be a rational proportion of the number of machinists at the yard to the number of the highest pay, not more than a total of two-thirds in the first two highest paid ratings combined."

## SKATERS ARRANGE FOR GAY NIGHT

Tidal Basin Will Be a Fairland  
To-morrow Evening—Many  
to Wear Costumes.

With the mercury still below the freezing point, and the wintery aspect of the city still present, preparations are being completed for the carnival to be held on the Tidal Basin to-morrow night, beginning at 7:30 o'clock. The carnival promises to be the most picturesque event held in the National Capital in years.

The Tidal Basin is to be transformed into a veritable fairland of colored electric lights and Japanese lanterns. The work of stringing the lamps has already been started. A band will be engaged to enliven the scene. Work on the erection of a bandstand was started yesterday.

The skaters will have a straightaway of a mile. A large area of the basin has been cleared of snow by the District "white wings," aided by volunteers. Collections have been taken at the rink side to defray the cost of the carnival. A big contribution box is stationed on the basin, and from the funds collected here it is expected to pay for the necessary preparations for the carnival. A large portion of the amount will go toward the erection of the bandstand and the hire of the music.

Many of the skaters will be costumed. Many fancy skaters will also be present to entertain the throng of spectators which is anticipated. Henri Martin, the champion amateur skater of Europe, who is charge d'affaires of the Swiss Legation, will be among the fancy skaters present. He has promised to give an exhibition. The arrangements for the carnival are in the hands of Dr. E. C. Meyer, of the Navy Department, and Captain, a prominent sculptor. Among the others who are aiding in the preparations for the skating carnival are Dr. Charles P. Grandfield, First Assistant Commandant, Second Infantry, N. G. D. C., Secretary of the Navy George W. L. Meyer, E. C. Palmer, Henri Martin, and Viscountess Benoit d'Azy.

### ALLEY PROBLEMS ARE CONSIDERED

Health Officer Woodward Makes  
Recommendations Toward Lessening Evils of Slums.

For the betterment of the public health, the lessening of fire danger, and the uplift of the community morally, Dr. William C. Woodward, health officer, has recommended to the Commissioners the elimination of as many alleys in the city as possible.

Dr. Woodward says that in some cases the present alleys may be turned into interior parks, and that in the remaining cases they can be converted into minor streets.

"The alley question," says Dr. Woodward, "not only involves the question of health, but also that of police and fire protection and the social status and aspirations of dwellers in alleys. Certainly no one can deny that the trend of alley life is against all these things. Action that has been taken toward the elimination of alley dwellings, with respect to the slums, or rather insanitary, Willow Tree alley, marks a step in the right direction, but only a very short step."
