

### ORDERED REFUSES TO RESIGN SEAT

Vice President Sherman Returns to Washington from Unsuccessful Mission to Chicago.

### MEANS FIGHT ON THE FLOOR

Vice President Sherman returned to Washington yesterday, but declined absolutely to comment on the object of his visit to Chicago or the result of it. There appears to be no doubt in the minds of Senators that the Vice President's mission, which was to induce Senator Lorimer to resign, failed signally, and that the case will have to be fought out on the floor of the Senate at an early date. That Senator Lorimer will be ousted is generally conceded, even by his friends in the Senate, who expressed considerable impatience yesterday over the persistence with which the Senator from Illinois clings to his seat in the face of the certainty of his title being held to be invalid.
