VICTORY WON IN RELIGIOUS HELPS CRUSADE AGAINST FOR SUMMER DAYS VULGAR POSTERS

Continued from Page One. Washington Bill Posting Company, and a director of the Poster Advertising Association of the United States, in answer to an appeal by the crusaders yesterday gave expression to his views in no unambiguous manner. His statement follows:

"I am heart and soul with the crusade against the objectionable bill poster, and will co-operate to the fullest extent with the crusaders of the Aloysius Truth Society and the Washington Herald. The Washington Bill Posting Company will positively and emphatically refuse to handle any poster which is indecent, vulgar, or objectionable from a moral point of view. As manager of this company, with absolute and exclusive control over all billboards in the District, I give my personal pledge that there will not be posted anywhere in Washington or its vicinity any paper displaying vicious or suggestive pictures and titles for theatrical or other productions, advertisements of certain unmentionable patent medicines, or show bills degrading woman's form.

Will Make Flat Refusals. "It will be useless for any person or company to prepare any such objectionable poster for display on the Washington billboards. I will flatly refuse to post it. I will go even further than this. If the gentlemen conducting the 'public morals crusade' will support and co-operate with me I will endeavor to stamp out the display of immoral posters in certain store and barber shop windows, by refusing to do billboard posting for companies which display objectionable window posters throughout the city. This form of advertising is not under the control of our company, however, and effective results would, therefore, have to be brought about indirectly.

Warning to Managers. Equally strong is the circular drawn up by a committee of the National Poster Printers and Bill Posters Associations, addressed as a "Warning to Poster Printers, Lithographers, Theatrical Managers, and Managers of Theaters." The circular reads as follows: "You are respectfully requested to use your influence to end the use of objectionable posters on the billboards; posters of the kind that are objectionable because of the titles that are used, or the scenes that are illustrated. The use of these posters is not for your best interests, any more than they are for the best interests of the business of the bill posters.

The Associated Bill Posters of the United States and Canada, in their constitution by a by-law that from this time is to be vigorously enforced, viz: Regarding sensational and suggestive titles used in advertising productions of plays. They have instructed members under a penalty to refuse to post any paper that carries titles or pictures that are deemed objectionable.

The circular is signed by Edward C. Donnelly, chairman, Boston, Mass.; Charles H. W. E. Buck, Boston, Mass.; Charles W. Jordan, Chicago; C. A. Sherman, St. Paul, Minn.; and W. S. Donaldson, St. Louis, Mo., representing the Poster Printers' Association; Will J. Davis, Jr., Chicago; John B. Baird, Little Rock, Ark.; Frank Zellweger, Lincoln, Neb.; and Fred Roy Ziller, Meriden, Miss., representing the Bill Posters' Association. At Georgetown University, the headquarters of the Truth Society, and among prominent members of the clergy and laity of various creeds, intense gratification was expressed last night at the outcome of the crusade. High tributes were paid Mr. Shoemaker for his clear-cut declarations in favor of public decency.
