Vermont Blueberry Cake. Cream together half a cupful of butter and a scant cupful of granulated sugar, adding one well-beaten egg, a tiny pinch of grated nutmeg, half a teaspoonful of lemon juice, half a cupful of sweet milk, and two heaping teaspoonfuls of baking powder sifted with sufficient pastry flour to form a cake batter.

Layer Cake with Date Filling. Make filling first. One cup chopped dates, scant cup sugar, small piece butter, heaping teaspoon flour, mixed with sugar, 2-3 cup water; put on stove, let cook slowly, stir occasionally to keep from burning.

Cheese Croquettes. One pound of grated cheese, four eggs, pinch of cayenne, salt; beat the whites of the eggs to a stiff froth, stir it into the cheese with salt and cayenne, mold into balls the size of a walnut, dip into beaten yolks of eggs, then roll in finely browned bread crumbs; fry quickly in deep kettle of boiling lard, serve warm on a platter garnished with lettuce.

NAT C. GOODWIN RESTING EASIER

Crops of Physicians and Nurses, Aided by Miss Moreland, Constantly at Actor's Bedside. Los Angeles, Cal., Aug. 16.—Nat C. Goodwin, who was severely injured yesterday by the overturning of a boat in the surf forty miles north of Venice, is resting easier to-night than at any time since the accident occurred.

After a thorough examination of the injured man this afternoon, Dr. J. C. Ferberg, C. W. Thomas, and Oscar Anderson gave out a statement to the effect that owing to considerable internal irritation it was impossible to determine at this time the exact extent of Goodwin's injuries.
