JOIN TO ABOLISH CAPITAL'S SLUMS. Charitable Organization to Ask Congress to Investigate Alley Conditions Here.

MORTALITY RATE SHOWN TO BE HIGH. Purchase of Property by Government Said to Be the Only Solution.

In a determined effort to abolish the slums of Washington, which, it is claimed, increase the annual death rate of the city by many per cent, and tend to increase immorality in the Capital, three welfare societies have joined, and propose to urge Congressional legislation toward cleaning up these pest spots.

According to statistics compiled by these organizations, there are 25 alleys in Washington, 15 of which are in the Northwest. There are 2,377 houses in these alleys and an estimated population of 16,000.

An alley directory of Washington, the first ever compiled, recently has been published by the slum clearing committee.

In it are listed all the pest spots of the city. The figures given are astounding. Statistics obtained from the District health report for last year by Dr. Van Schaick show that the death rate for infants under one year of age in the Washington alleys is 100 per cent greater than in the streets.

A law is in effect which permits the changing of alleys into minor streets, condemnation, and the assessment of benefit of adjoining property.

Brilliant Helen Keller Shrinks from Interview. Famous Woman Who Overcame Every Physical Handicap in Life Visiting Friends Here.

Modestly declining to be interviewed, Miss Helen Keller, the blind and deaf, but not mute woman, famous throughout the world for her remarkable literary and educational accomplishments, when seen yesterday at the home of Mrs. Philip Smith, 236 Newark Street, Cleveland Park, stated it was her earnest desire that her visit here be considered as an ordinary social event.

Miss Keller arrived in Washington last Tuesday and will be the guest of Mrs. Smith for another week. Recently Miss Keller suffered a slight indisposition and her physician recommended that she take a complete rest for several weeks.

Miss Keller is known in every corner of the world for her marvelous achievements, in the face of extraordinary physical handicaps, and she is regarded as a writer that her literary gifts are considered the work of a genius.

One of the most astounding features of Miss Keller's literary work is her wonderful faculty to picture things as they really are. This would seem impossible to one who has never enjoyed the senses of sight and hearing.

The life story of Miss Keller is familiar to almost everyone. Her extraordinary physical handicaps and the wonder of scientists all over the world. When but two years old, Miss Keller was robbed of her sight, hearing and speech by scarlet fever.

Displaying remarkable mental powers even when a child, many people became interested in Miss Keller. Miss Anna M. The most notorious alleys of the city, Willow Tree, Goat, Hog, Brewery Court, Blagden, A. B. C. Alley, Ambush Alley, Crane Alley, Crater Alley, Gun Alley, Hope Avenue, Katie's Alley, Cow Alley, Moonshine Alley, Nell's Court, Pig Alley, Three-and-half Street Alley, Christian Alley, Naylor's Alley, Hovers Court, Alley, Pork and Alley, and Snow's Court, are at present among the most notorious slums of the city, and the ones which the welfare workers are making the most strenuous effort to abolish.

Indications are that this will be the banner year in the history of the District night schools. B. W. Murch, who has charge of them, last night predicted that there would be an increase in the enrollment this year over last of 20 or 30 pupils.

Compensates for Injustice. "In Europe," said Mr. Boechar yesterday, during the last twenty-five years, a number of countries have enacted elaborate statutes by which the state undertakes to compensate those individuals who through mistakes in the administration of criminal justice have suffered wrongs of the kind brought out in the Epps case.
