ENCROACHING UPON RIGHTS OF OTHERS

Boys Without Respect for Property of Others Grow Into Undesirable Citizens.

By FRANCES SHAFER. Late this summer and fall when the fruit trees and grape vines hung low with their luscious burdens, almost everybody in the city who owned a single tree or a diminutive orchard daily expected something to happen.

Each morning and evening as they slipped out to look over their treasures and watch them change from green to lovely, ripened tints, they feared that the boy despoiler had been there before them, knocking down the fruit, breaking off branches, tramping and destroying everywhere.

Then some fine day, when they had begun to believe they might escape, after all, they made the usual visit.

And those who never have tried it do not appreciate just how disappointing it is, in lieu of perfect trees and vines, with their ripened fruit, to find broken boughs and fruit quite gone. They cannot understand it, for they think the fruit is not so valuable and wears things that happen every day without a ripple of excitement anywhere.

They do not reckon with the real pleasure of following that bit of nature from the flowering time to the day of the ripened fruit and think it is "much ado about nothing" to fume and fuss over the loss of a little fruit because it happens to be one's own.

But some time they will set out young trees; will watch them grow and grow until they are old enough and strong enough to bear their beautiful burdens. And then, when the fruit is stolen and scattered, they will understand.

The Plain Fact. But it is not the individual loss that counts the most, for that is soon forgotten. It is the deplorable disregard of property rights on the part of young lads and elder boys who some day are going to take their place in the world with the full rights of citizens.


Apparently they will take it without the slightest thought or care for property or any other rights than their own. And it does not augur well for the boys of the communities where they live.

Something is wrong in any home where boys and girls are not taught that they can go so far and no farther without encroaching upon the rights of others. And whatever one may say of the moral end of overreaching their rights, whether by boys and girls or men and women, there is another viewpoint that cannot be ignored. That is, it cannot, and should not, be comfortable living if plunderers are just undesirable anywhere and everywhere.

Pineapple Jelly.

To two cups of grated pineapple add one cup sugar and let stand half an hour. Then press through a puree strainer and whip until it begins to thicken. Decorate a cylinder mold with blanched almonds; fill in the pineapple and pack in cracked ice with just a little salt and let it stand two hours. When ready to serve, turn the jelly out on a flat dish and pour whipped cream around it.

Lightly brown in the oven. A very tasty and dainty way to serve apples.
