

G. C. P. LEADERS TO MEET HERE

Republican Executive Committee Meets Saturday to Discuss Future Policy.

HILLES ISSUED CALL

Time of Nation-wide Conference Most Important Matter to Be Considered.

There is a daily increasing interest among Republicans on Capitol Hill in the meeting of the Republican National Executive Committee which will be held in Washington Saturday.

The committee comes together in response to a call issued by Chairman Hilles of the Republican National Committee. It is likely many prominent Republicans from the "States" will come to Washington to talk over the situation that confronts their party.

Some of the most interesting features of the meeting will be the formal request submitted on behalf of the recent conference of progressive Republicans at Chicago by the "Committee of Iowa," and a committee of progressive Republicans from the "States" will come to Washington to talk over the situation that confronts their party.

In spite of reports that have been current in the last few days that the members of the Republican National Committee do not look with favor on the national conference, the latest canvass of the members of the committee, made by one of the most prominent conservative Republicans in the country, shows a clear majority in favor of according to the request of the Progressives in the party.

Early Conviction Advocated.

There is a difference of opinion as to the date when the conference should be held. Senator Cummins is eager to have the conference held on September 10 and not later than September 10 or October 10.

Senator Root and others, who are willing to wait in a national-wide conference, believe that better results will be obtained by deferring the conference or national convention until early next year.

That evidently Senator Cummins and his following of progressive Republicans believe that it would be dangerous to delay the work of reorganizing the party. In this they pay a compliment to the party.

It is believed that the conference will be held in the city of Washington, and that the work should begin at once that will give impetus with the lack of interest in his suggestion and personally called the Chicago conference and secured the best of the executive committee together and the whole matter will be finished on Saturday.

Senator La Follette, who is known to be an active candidate for the Republican nomination in 1916, is holding about from the movement, but is watching its development. The bill provides that medals be awarded on behalf of Congress, may bestow such medals upon the recommendation of the commanding officer of the army or navy. Medals may be awarded to any officer or enlisted man in the army or navy.
