Miss Jessie Herriott Fascinates Audience Composed of Prominent Washington Folk. "Tango" Made Most Graceful.

Just what its name implies—a couple of cooing, crooning, dreamy steps and then a bit of hesitancy as it lingers for the whiplash of a "sweet nothing" from your partner—that is the new dance, the "Hesitation Waltz," as it was introduced before a large audience including many society folk, at a recital by Miss Jessie Herriott yesterday.

The affair was given in the small ballroom of the New Willard, and had as its patronesses Mrs. Champ Clark, Mrs. Christian D. Hennick, Mrs. Harvey W. Wiley and a score of other prominent women.

That the "tango" has been much maligned if it is danced as Miss Herriott and her partner, Bruce Cleveland, danced it, was the opinion of those present, who seemed fascinated with the spryness and general grace of the dance, and especially for a slight of more of it. But it wasn't the real rough, tough "tango" that the artists presented; it was something modified, one might say, something "made over." Everybody agreed it "got a bit naughty, but real nice."

Besides the "innovations" Miss Herriott, who undeniably is an artist of rare charm and grace, danced an ethereal solo dance, a Spanish solo dance and an interesting solo dance, interspersing a poem, "Autumn."
