DENISON NOMINATION HELD UP.

Philippine Commission Appointee Said to Be Republican.

T. Denison, of New York, to be a member of the Philippine commission and secretary of the interior for the islands, was held up by the Senate Philippines Committee yesterday, pending an investigation of the statement that Denison is a Republican.

Denison was an Assistant Attorney General under the Taft administration, and was an assistant to Henry L. Stimson when the latter was a district attorney in New York. Denison later became identified with the Progressive movement, according to a report, and on the formation of the Progressive party offered his resignation to President Taft, but it was not accepted.

The Senate committee voted to report favorably on H. S. Martin, of Kansas, to be a member of the Philippine commission and secretary of public instruction and vice governor of the islands, and Clinton L. Riggs, of Maryland, to be a member of the Philippine commission and secretary of the island departments of commerce and police.

HOUSE GETS NEW MEMBERS.

Administration of Oath Does Not Change Party Alignment.

In the House yesterday three new members of Congress took the oath, thus bringing it up to its full quota for the first time since the sixty-third Congress came into being.

Representatives Cantor and Loft of New York, Democrats, respectively, successors to Francis Burton Harrison, now governor general of the Philippine Islands, and Timothy D. Sullivan, deceased, Representative Paige, of the Third Massachusetts, a Republican, takes the seat of Representative Wilder, deceased, who was also a Republican.

By these changes the House stands in the matter of party alignments exactly as originally organized in April of this year.
