

Wife of Rabbi Abram Simon Preaches in Boston Temple

Declares that the Obligation to Be Useful to the Nation Rests Upon Israel in the Land at Present Time.

Boston, Mass., Nov. 28.—Responsibility, not suffrage, or suffrage, is the badge of Israel, declares Mrs. Abram Simon, wife of Dr. Abram Simon, of Washington, in a sermon delivered from the pulpit of the Temple Israel in this city tonight.

MRS. ABRAM SIMON, wife of Rabbi Simon, who preached sermon on "The Responsibility of Israel" in Boston Temple.



"I dare say that the synagogue was the greatest enterprise which the Jew undertook, and which in the course of his checkered history has become the chief support of his hope and the reasonable hope of his survival. The average Jew ought to know that for the past 2,000 years the modest synagogue was Israel's tower of strength, its fortress of safety, its refuge in its unpretentious walls he found hope, a home, a life that binds."

"We bring to America the religious unity of the synagogue. The temple, we call it, has come to stay and to serve. The Jew places his highest hopes in it. He continues to find in it the exponent of his religious convictions. He finds in it the authority for many of his actions and the inspiring charge for sustained loyalty."

"Religion is destined to be the eschaton in earnest of the spiritual revival in our country. It is a spiritual revival in the church doors. Are the precepts and prophecies of religion embalmed? Is religion's voice dying music of a swan song? None that sees and hears and knows will confess that religion is doomed."

"We, as Jews, must stand for law and order. We must stand for the sacredness of the marital tie; we must bring the whole force of religious authority toward the creation of reverence and the prohibition of juvenile delinquency. We must turn ourselves for the honor of Jewish chastity, Jewish charity, Jewish integrity. We feel that we must fashion such a type of men who will be civic leaders, exemplars of commercial morality, promoters of domestic parity. We can do it, we must do it."

"There is any connection between the resurgence of religion and the rise of the woman movement? I think there is. And I believe that there will be a still more intimate and positive relationship between the synagogue and the American Jewess. The synagogue shall bear the call of the sister. The synagogue is not a masculine institution. It must find a place of equal privilege, prayer, activity, and responsibility for the Jewess. Shall she be the creator of the new enthusiasm in Israel? It is not your duty to raise money, but to raise Jews, to raise hopes, to raise the standard. If men stand backward in appreciating the Temple it is the woman's opportunity to step forward into the breach. If the women of the Jewish congregations in this land were in dead earnest would the trustees or rabbis refuse them a respectful hearing? As I know our rabbis, I feel that they are waiting for some genuine, whole-souled, and fervent expression of aid and cooperation with them along these lines."

"So in closing may I leave you with this sentiment:
To faith that gives in woman's arms,
And the faith that sees when woman smiles:
To the faith which sees beyond the skies
And set forth with life's richest joys,
To the sisterhood's motto, full and wise:
Here's to faith, that never dies, never tires,
Here's to faith."

Fastest Boxmaker.
Dayton, Oreg., Nov. 26.—Willie Bellows is believed here to be the fastest apple boxmaker in the Northwest. In a season his average is 600 daily. In La Grande, Oreg., he broke a record, manufacturing 2,000 boxes in ten and a half days. On another occasion he made 60 boxes daily for fifty-eight days. In his regular speed he is able to keep ten trained apple pickers filling his boxes as he makes them.






