Postmaster General Burleson has by direction of the President appointed 23,317 appointments since his coming into office. Of these 23,317 have been of the Presidential grade and 18,146 of the fourth class.

May 11, 1864—Gen. J. E. B. Stuart, the Famous Confederate Cavalry Leader, Was Mortally Wounded in an Engagement at Yellow Tavern, Near Richmond, Between a Part of His Forces and Those of Gen. Sheridan.

Written Expressly for The Herald. Fifty years ago today Gen. J. E. B. Stuart, the famous Confederate cavalry leader, was mortally wounded in an engagement at Yellow Tavern, near Richmond, between a part of his forces and those of Gen. Sheridan.

The loss of Stuart to the Confederacy was the result of a movement by the Federal cavalry that had begun on May 4, near Spotsylvania Courthouse, where the Federal army, under Grant, was confronting that of Lee. As the Federals pushed to Beaver's Dam Station on their wagon trains, Gen. Sheridan had volunteered to draw off the enemy's cavalry by starting on a raid toward Richmond. The sole objective of the movement was Stuart's command, as Sheridan had no intention of attacking Richmond.

The column as it took up the march on a bright and warm morning presented a picture like that which had never before been seen in the war.


