The fact that influences the betting odds is that Englishmen are convinced that Welsh is clever enough to keep away from the champion for the whole twenty rounds in which case they are sure he will get the decision and the title. I firmly believe that Ritchie will land the knock-out blow somewhere about the fifteenth round and even the fight goes the limit I think the champion must get the decision.
