Baltimore, Md., Aug. 2.—The Washington Cricket Club was defeated by the Baltimore Sons of St. George eleven, on the latter's athletic field at Sottum, Md., this afternoon, by a score of 52 to 39, both teams putting up a strong game that was replete with sensational fielding.

Branch, of the Washington eleven, not only bowled an exceptionally good game, but fielded his position perfectly, making several difficult catches and disposing of the Monumentals' cricket-batter, Dr. Samuels, after a swift sprint to the boundary fence. Dr. Cannon was also very much in evidence in the bowling crease, retiring five of the Baltimore batsmen, and looking very much as if the visitors would win out.

Dr. L. D. Samuels, captain of the Sons, used every bowler on the team to stop the advance of the Capital City contingent, but it was not until he went into the bowling crease that the tide was reversed.

Harry Windsor, of the Sons, was top score with fifteen, closely followed by Jim Guthrie, who got a thirteenth. George James pulled off several clever stunts in the fielding line.

YALE CREW WOULD LOSE TO COLUMBIA

Yale Boat Could Not Match Up to the New Yorkers' Shell, But Race Would Be Close.

Here is a question that recently was argued on all sides. "If the 1914 Columbia and Yale crews, respective winners in their regattas, were matched up, which crew would win and by how much?"

The answer seems to be, that if both crews rowed in the same form as they did on regatta days, Columbia would beat Yale by about thirty-three boat lengths, or nearly 1,000 feet in a four-mile race. But if such a race really were rowed, it is doubtful if Columbia would win by such a margin—or anything like that margin.

Yale's time for the four miles was twenty-one minutes and sixteen seconds. Columbia's time was nineteen minutes and twenty-seven and four-fifths seconds. One of our mathematical friends assures us that these figures when properly worked out will show that Columbia's average time was eighteen and one-half feet a second against sixteen and one-half feet a second for Yale.

Without the aid of an adding or subtracting machine it will be found that if the crews were matched up on regatta days, Columbia would be over the finish line while Yale still was about 1,000 feet away—which is quite some distance.
