DE AGUERO ASKS WOULD HAVE THE TREASURY ISSUE FIVE BILLIONS IN NOTES.

SECURITIES THEN SAFE

Financier Believes National Credit Should Stand Behind American Stocks Held by Foreigners.

M. E. de Agiero, the president of the New York Consolidated Stock Exchange, in a letter sent here, suggests a plan for the issue of the United States government of Treasury notes to absorb the European liquidation of American State, municipal, and railway dividend and interest-paying stocks and bonds, amounting to not to exceed \$5,000,000,000. It is suggested to end the present congestion in the security market and to take care of the European liquidation.

Fear Caused Closing.

The fear of this liquidation has closed every stock exchange in this country, with the result that an illegitimate market has been growing in the street unretted by any of the rules and regulations which should safeguard dealings in securities.
