WOMEN TO GET VOTE THROUGH COURT TEST

Mrs. Colby Says Case in Supreme Court Probably Would Provide Recognition at Polls.

The suffrage question will be finally decided when some woman asks if three of the women are not entitled to vote under the Constitution. Mrs. Clara Bewick Colby said yesterday in an address at the Secular League meeting in the Pythian Temple.

"Women may obtain the exercise of the franchise in four ways," said Mrs. Colby. "First, by amendment of all the State constitutions by vote of the electorate. Second, by an amendment to the Constitution submitted by a two-thirds vote of both houses of Congress and ratified by three-fourths of the State legislatures. Third, by a referendum. Fourth, the question could be decided if some woman, having her vote refused by a State, should bring a test case before the Supreme Court, and it should be decided in her favor. This last, I think, is the way it will finally be decided."

Mrs. Colby discussed the bill which will be before Congress on January 6, whereby women would be given the power to vote for Senators and Representatives. The Secular League voted to favor this bill. Several speakers, in discussion, disagreed with Mrs. Colby. During their speeches, the Constitution was shot at by pieces, the exploiting classes were denounced and woman was declared to be cursed by God in the Bible.

Thirty persons were arrested by the "vice squad" early yesterday in a raid on the Piedmont Hotel, Sixth street and Missouri avenue northwest.
