CRUSHING DEFEATS SUFFERED BY COLONIAL TROOPS AT HANDS OF THE TURKS.

CAIRO CITY OF GLOOM. Two Anglo-Indian Columns Nearly Wiped Out, Italians Say—Suez Canal in Peril.

By BRINGTON D. ALLAIRE. Rome, Feb. 24. (By mail)—Notwithstanding the numerous centenary and all press messages and private letters, and the reassuring statements issued by the English authorities about the situation in Egypt, Italians who have just arrived here from Cairo state that all has not gone as England wished along the Suez Canal.

Returning Italians say that Cairo, which, up to a month ago, sported an air of confidence in the ability of the colonial troops to prevent the invasion, now lives in constant fear of calamity. The Christian and European elements of the population are under the impression that their lives and properties are no longer safe.

Since the Petwa was handed down in Constantinople proclaiming the intentions of the triple entente against Islam, the Mohammedans no longer approach the English on former terms, but live secluded in the native district, spending most of their time in the temples.

Now and then a Christian banderole is found mysteriously placed in the dark alleys of the Fish Market in a certain quarter of the city and it is invariably found that the victim's heart has been split with a double-edged dagger such as the Mohammedans carry.

Still deeper is the mystery which surrounds the movements of the colonial troops. There is strong ground for belief that there have been fierce engagements in which the British lost heavily.

Column Nearly Wiped Out. Signor Giarola Civini attempted to send a story through to the Corriere della Sera, but the British censor refused to let it pass. Then it was taken to Syracuse and carried there to Milan by a friend of the correspondent.

The account contained information obtained from an Italian army aviator, who is in the pay of the English. According to his information, on January 17 an Anglo-Indian column of 2,000 men, supported by six mountain pieces, advanced as far as Bir-el-Baidar, where the Turkish outposts were supposed to be. Near that place the column met a few groups of Bedouins, who, on being attacked, retreated.

The English officers ordered the Bedouins pursued. Suddenly large Turkish forces emerged from behind the dunes. The column fought bravely, but the numbers of Bedouins increased and the British column was surrounded. Several brilliant charges were delivered and finally the column succeeded in breaking a way for a retreat, but it lost all its artillery and only about 1,500 men straggled back into El Kaatara.

Three days later another British column, consisting of 200 British and 1,000 Arab, a distance of ten miles. It was also attacked among the dunes and narrowly escaped the same fate as the first. Only about 200 British were killed and about 1,000 wounded.

The outside world has never heard of these engagements. Later, when a shipload of wounded reached Cairo, it was announced that they were convalescent soldiers sent to Egypt to recuperate.


