Government's Decision on Rum to Be Given This Week.

AGITATION IS STRONG Papers Print "Ad" Calling on Public to Subscribe to Nationwide Pledge.

By ORTON W. TOWNSEN. London, April 3.—The government's decision on the drink question is anticipated early in the coming week, and it is believed that it will be practically as forecast in my dispatch of Wednesday.

The British press is now almost unanimous in the opinion that the government action will include total prohibition of spirit traffic.

It is not at all certain, however, that the government will listen to the appeal for the retention of beer, especially in view of the uncertain voice of those representing the best interests of the nation.
