

TREASURY NEEDS SPECIAL SESSION

Leaders in Congress Say Revenue Laws Should Be Changed Soon.

DEFICIT OF \$30,000,000?

Custom Duties Yield \$70,000,000 Less Than Year Ago—McAdoo May Issue Panama Canal Bonds.

A special session of Congress in the fall to take stock of Treasury conditions with a view to effecting important changes in the revenue laws is now regarded as more than a probability in administration circles.

The condition of the Treasury is regarded by the administration as the biggest domestic problem with which it is now dealing.

Admit \$30,000,000 Deficit.

Some Treasury officials admit that on June 30, the end of the current year, the deficit on the twelve months' business will be about \$30,000,000.

Some months ago Secretary McAdoo announced that a yield of approximately \$100,000,000 from the corporation and income taxes would save the situation at the end of the year.

So far as the present is concerned, the administration is not particularly worried. On July 1 the Secretary of the Treasury could authorize an issue of Panama Canal bonds or short-time notes to take up the slack between outgoing and incoming.

At 4.25 while the streets were ringing with the news that mobilization had been ordered, Baron von Macchio hurried to the ministry for a conference with Baron Sonnino.

Meanwhile Minister of War Zupelli, at 2.30, had visited the king to submit for his signature a number of important documents. The decree of mobilization, it is believed, was not the least of them.

The Italian government quite capriciously renounced all its obligations and the Austro-Hungarian government declines to accept responsibility for the consequences which may result from this action.

Earlier in the day King Victor issued a manifesto to the nation explaining why Italy was forced to resort to arms, and appealing to the nation to do its duty and win victory for the just cause.

Quotes Welborn's Letter.

"Now, I want to call your attention to the fact that after Ludlow, after the killings, after all I have stated to you, and many other things had transpired, you received a letter from Mr. Welborn (the president of the fuel company), this man of few convictions and man of fine heart, as you say, in which he said: 'I appreciate very much your expressions of sympathy for my personal welfare, my health has never been better during the past year, and I am hardly conscious of any strain. The knowledge that I have your confidence and support makes everything easy.'"

"That is, all the deaths and all the disgrace and everything was easy to him, and he felt no remorse, and he suggested to you that you have a vast influence over that of the ordinary stockholder, over the men connected with you in these industries, and that you ought to raise your voice in protest if human beings were being mistreated."

Chairman Walsh was intensely earnest in voice and gesture. He put this long question to Mr. Rockefeller, but the latter listened to it without the slightest display of emotion, and answered: "I see no connection whatever between the letter and the statement you make."
