- "Curds and cream, the flower of country fare."—Dryden. BREAKFAST: Cornmeal, Cream, Sugar, Coffee. LUNCHEON OR SUPPER: Chopped Tomatoes, Corn Salad, Iced Tea, Wafer. DINNER: Iced Tomato Soufflé, Roast of Lamb, Peas, Beet Salad, Peach Shortcake. Sausage—Broil cakes of sausage meat, and serve them with a little melted butter and minced parsley spread on toast. Hollow out a tomato for each person, and fill it with corn, boiled and cut from the ears, mixed with minced green peas, and celery, tomato pulp and French dressing, highly seasoned. Served chilled through on lettuce leaves. Cook over low heat for four or five hours. Then add half a cup of diced carrot, turnip, onion, and celery, and brown in a tablespoonful of butter. Add also a sprig of parsley, a slice of bacon, and salt. Cook for an hour and a half more. Cool, remove fat, and chill in ice box. W. C. T. U. in Fifty Countries.
