SCOUT CAMPAIGN MAY END MONDAY. Decision Reached to Continue Efforts Until \$30,000 Is Raised.

NEARLY \$9,000 IN HAND. Arthur C. Moses Says Workers Have Had to Explain What Movement Means to Residents of Capital.

Owing to the inability of members of the twenty-four teams who are working to raise \$30,000 to finance the Boy Scout movement in Washington for the next three years, to cover the territory allotted to them in the three-day period which closed last night, it was decided yesterday to continue the campaign until Monday night. The sum raised thus far is about \$9,000.

RETIRED BANKER DIES. J. D. Langhorne Was Naval Officer in War Against Mexico.

John Deval Langhorne, 51, died in his home, 1215 G street, northwest, yesterday morning. Mr. Langhorne graduated from the Naval Academy in 1847 and became midshipman, taking part in the attack on Vera Cruz, where he was wounded. Resigning in 1852, he established a banking business in Lynchburg, Va., which he moved to Washington in 1854 and lived here up to the time of his death.

Spirit Message from Prof. Friend Who Was Lost on the Lusitania. Harvard Fellow, Through Medium, Tells Research Society He Is an Infant in New Life, but Hopes to Learn—Accepted as Genuine by Dr. Hyslop.

New York, Nov. 24.—The American Society for Psychical Research has received a message from Prof. Edwin Friend, who was lost on the Lusitania. The message came through Mrs. Celestine Glenn, who, members of the society state to be one of the most celebrated mediums in the world. It is now a part of the official records of the organization. It follows: "It will take me some time before I can give you a full report upon my investigations here. I feel that I was a mere youth in the cause upon the earth. But I feel now that since I have had the experience with you upon the earth I have been strengthened here. And I feel that I will bring back to you something that will guide you more thoroughly and fully than I could have been able to have imparted otherwise. And I want to know more of myself. I am just in my infancy here."
