


### THE EPISCOPAL MARRIAGE CEREMONY As Performed at President's Wedding

The full Episcopal service was used by the Rev. Dr. Smith in marrying the President and Mrs. Galt, the word "obey" being used with Mrs. Galt's full consent. The service opened with the following exhortation: "Dear beloved, we are gathered to-day here in the sight of God, and in the face of this company, to join together this man and this woman in holy matrimony; which is an honorable estate, instituted of God in the time of man's innocence, signifying unto us the mystical union that is betwixt Christ and His Church; with His presence and first miracle that He wrought in Canaan of Galilee, and is commended of St. Paul to be honorable among all men; and therefore is not by any to be entered into unadvisedly or lightly; but reverently, discreetly, advisedly, soberly, and in the fear of God. Into this holy estate these two persons present come now to be joined. If any man can show just cause why they may not lawfully be joined together, let him now speak, or else hereafter forever hold his peace."

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### ITALIAN SENATE SUPPORTS WAR

Rome, Dec. 18.—The Italian Senate today unanimously voted its confidence in the government's conduct of the war. The chamber of deputies recently took similar action.

### GATO CIGAR FACTORY BURNED

Key West, Fla., Dec. 18.—The E. H. Gato cigar factory, which employed 500 persons, was destroyed by fire today.

### HEAVY FIRE ON TRENCHES

French Maintaining Steady Bombardment of German Defenses. Special cable to the Washington Herald. Paris, Dec. 18.—The Official War Report says: "Between the Somme and the Oise we subjected the German trenches in the region of Fricourt to an intense bombardment. One of our patrols surprised an enemy patrol in the bend of the Oise and made them prisoners."
