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TARBELL PAINTINGS PLACED ON EXHIBIT

Thousands View Collection of Paintings of Famous American Painter at Corcoran Art Gallery.

Mr. Tarbell was born at West Groton, Mass. He is a pupil of Boston Museum School and of Boulogne and Lefebvre in Paris.

His first pictures were shown at the National Academy of Design, New York, in 1890, where they were awarded the Clarke Prize.

The pictures will be on exhibition until February 13.
