WEATHER CONDITIONS

For the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia—Overcast weather, with probably showers Friday and Saturday; somewhat lower temperature Sunday; moderate southerly winds.
 The temperature has risen throughout the Atlantic States, the Upper Ohio Valley, and the southern portion of the region of the Great Lakes. Considerably cooler weather has prevailed in the Rocky Mountain and Western Plains regions and the Pacific States.
 The indications are that the disturbance over the Upper Mississippi Valley will advance slowly eastward and be attended by unsettled weather and showers over much of the country east of the Mississippi River during the next thirty-six hours.
 The temperature will be lower Friday and Saturday in the southern portion of the region of the Great Lakes, the Ohio Valley, Tennessee, and the East Gulf States, and Saturday in the interior of the Middle Atlantic and South Atlantic States.

RUSS LAND IN FRANCE.

Flotilla of Transports Lands Army at Marseilles.
 Amsterdam, April 19.—As an immediate result, it is believed, of the recent allied conference in Paris, a great flotilla of Russian transports arrived at Marseilles, and at noon today began disembarking a strong force of Russian troops, who are to fight beside the French on the western front.
 The landing of the Russian troops, heralded by Gen. Joffre in an army order today, as "another striking proof of the devotion of Russia to the common cause," came as one of the surprises of the war.

ALIEN-BORN PROTEST THREATENED BREAK
 Sheaves of Telegrams Reach Members of Congress Pleading for Friendly Relations with Germany.
 Sheaves of telegrams from German-American, Austrian-American and Hungarian-American societies and individuals to members of Congress protesting against the severance of diplomatic relations with Germany yesterday attested the impression with which the President's message has been received.
 The largest volume of protests, some of them appeals to avert the threatened break, others denouncing the administration, came from the Middle Western States. Members of the Ohio delegation received them by the score, but they came from almost every State in the Union, mainly from Texas, Maryland, Illinois and Pennsylvania.
 It was apparent that the members of societies and associations were not content to have a protest filed by the representatives of these organizations. There were telegrams by the hundred from individuals, few of them phrased in the same language as is often the case when the movement is directed from a common source.

CHURCHES TO OBSERVE "THREE HOURS' AGONY"
 Services Commemorating Time Jesus Hung on Cross Will Be Held Today.
 The "three hours' agony" service, commemorative of the time which the Savior hung on the cross on Mount Calvary, will be observed in the Episcopal and Catholic churches of the city from noon until 3 o'clock today.
 The services in all the churches will be practically the same. They will consist of short discourses on the seven last words of Jesus. At the Church of the Epiphany, the exercises will begin at noon. At 10 o'clock this morning, Rev. Dr. Randolph H. McKim, rector of the church, will conduct Good Friday services.
 More than 400 attended Maundy Thursday services at that church last evening. Thousands of Catholics observed Maundy Thursday by making pilgrimages to at least three churches in different sections of the city. The altars were elaborately decorated with Easter flowers that lifted the veil of Lenten solitude. Special services also were held in the Lutheran churches yesterday.
