Commissioners Will Not
Change Proposed Asylum
Site, Says Report

PUBLIC HEARING IS HELD

District Heads Probably Will Pass
Over Protests of Six Hun-
dred Citizens.

It was regarded as unlikely at the District Building yesterday afternoon that the Commissioners would reverse their decision to erect the new Municipal Hospital at Fourteenth and Upshur streets northwest.

Commissioner Newman said, however, that the verbal and written protests against the site selected, filed by more than 600 residents of the northwest at a public hearing yesterday morning, would be carefully considered. The hearing was the largest ever held at the District Building, crowding the board room to its capacity.
