HUGHES GAINS IN POPULARITY

Newspaper's Reports Indicate Roosevelt as Running Strong Second.

T. R. LOSES 28 DELEGATES

Canvass of Situation Gives 452 Already Named Who Really Favor Nomination of Justice.

Sentiment for Justice Hughes for the Republican Presidential nomination is increasing rapidly, according to reports received by the New York Herald.

This is the information which The Herald has obtained from its correspondents throughout the country. There is little indication that the reported combination of "favorite son" candidates against the two leaders has had the result expected by the Old Guard.

Reports to The Herald indicate that the support for Justice Hughes has increased by forty-nine delegates during the week in addition to those elected or indicated by primary results during that time. It is likely that Mr. Roosevelt has lost twenty-eight delegates which The Herald heretofore has classified for him.

Based entirely upon the assumption that Justice Hughes will not refuse the nomination and upon calculations of what will happen when the "favorite son" candidates are eliminated, The Herald's canvass of the situation gives 452 delegates already elected who really favor the nomination of Justice Hughes.

This is only forty-one votes from the 493 necessary to nominate, with forty-six delegates yet to be selected. The eight Vermont delegates will not be selected until next Friday, but the primary indication that they will be for Justice Hughes has been considered in making the estimate of delegates.

The gain for Justice Hughes over The Herald's earlier estimate has come mostly through rearrangement of its figures for Minnesota and Missouri. The Herald's original information was that all of Minnesota's twenty-four delegates were likely to be for Roosevelt.

Missouri veers to Hughes. In Missouri the entire delegation of thirty-six delegates, classified anti-Roosevelt, is now said to have veered toward Justice Hughes. There are votes of German descent in Missouri. They are said to favor the nomination of the Justice almost without exception.

DR. VAN SCHAICK RAPS ANTI-VIVISECTIONISTS Says Animal Killing Is Justified for Science—Humane Sunday Observed in Churches.

"There has never been anything more unfair to the human race than the propaganda of the anti-vivisectionists," declared Rev. Dr. John Van Schaick, Jr., pastor of the Church of Our Father, in his sermon on the humane treatment of animals yesterday morning.

His talk was one of many delivered in observance of Humane Sunday, a day set aside by the ministers of the Humane Society of Washington for sermons on the just care of animals.

"Just as I cannot join in the movement for the elimination of animals from food purposes, I could not join in a propaganda which would keep either human or animal life safe if their killing was for scientific purposes. To my mind, one of the highest callings is for men to die for humanity."

Some persons object to humanitarian work for animals being done while there is so much death and suffering among the people of Europe. These persons are not just in the weighing of their balances, because the life of an animal is something to be protected just as the life of a man providing there is no just cause for death.

Child Strangles to Death. Wilkesbarre, Pa., May 21.—Moses, 4-month-old son of Moses James, strangled to death while taking milk from a nursing bottle. The child went to sleep nursing. When the mother went to the crib a few hours later the boy was dead.

Ocean War Risk Rates Drop. New York, May 21.—Transatlantic war risk rates have dropped from 3 per cent to 2 per cent in both the New York and London markets during the last week.
