U. S. Treasury Statement.

The condition of the United States Treasury at the close of business yesterday was: Net balance in general fund, \$129,552,227; total receipts, \$2,449,352; total payments, \$1,827,655. The deficit this fiscal year is \$50,546,655 against a deficit of \$107,332,803 last year, exclusive of Panama Canal and public debt transactions. Revenue receipts this fiscal year up to the close of business on May 25, \$600,483,025.46; revenue receipts at the close of business on May 25, 1915, \$578,009,379.58. Ordinary disbursements this fiscal year up to the close of business on May 25, \$651,720,342.93; ordinary disbursements at the close of business on May 25, 1915, \$667,182,367.31.

NEGRO BUSINESS MEN TO HOLD AUTO PARADE

Hundreds of Entries Are Received for Procession to Be Held in Capital Today.

An elaborate automobile floral parade will be staged here this afternoon to boost the colored business interests of the city. Those in charge of arrangements expressed the belief last night that it will be the biggest affair ever held by the colored residents of the District. Up to last night hundreds of entries had been received by Charles L. Skinner, automobile editor of the Washington Bee, at his office, 1109 I street northwest. To stimulate interest in the parade, a number of trophies have been secured and will be awarded to the best appearing machines in the parade. Among the prizes is a silver loving cup, donated by Joseph Berberich, shoe merchant, who is one of the judges. Commissioner Louis Brownlow and Maj. Raymond W. Pullman, superintendent of police, also are members of the board of judges.
