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DEWEY'S ADVICE MAY BE HEEDED

Naval Officers Believe Congress Will Accept Admiral's Plea for More Battleships.

Admiral Dewey's interview, stating that we should profit by every lesson taught by the North Sea battle and showing the futility of battleshipers attempting to cope with battleships, found unanimous support from line officers of the service yesterday.

Naval experts emphasize the necessity for reinforcing the fleet with at least two of the most modern types of super-Dreadnoughts. The general board already has plans drawn up for two or four of these fighting monsters of approximately 36,000 tons displacement and equipped with 14-inch or 16-inch guns.
