

WEDDED TEACHER IS REINSTATED
 Mrs. Gladys Hellman, Dismissed Under Rule 45, Regains School Position.

The Board of Education, at its meeting in the Franklin School Building yesterday afternoon, reinstated as a teacher Mrs. Gladys Strong Hellman, the woman who killed rule 45, of the Board of Education code, which automatically dismissed teachers who married.
