Car arrived in New York City on August 1st at 1.30 P.M. having covered 4889 miles on high gear.

Car was immediately driven to the Sheepshead Bay Speedway where a 10 Mile Speed Test was held under official sanction Number 984. Recorded official time 36.30 seconds an average of 60.64 miles per hour. Tests on transmission were then expanded and found intact and same as sealed in San Diego.


