

DREADNOUGHTS LOST, IS CLAIM

Two Huge British Warships Destroyed by Zeppelins, "Fatherland" Declares.

(By the International News Service.) New York, Aug. 18.—That two of the newest British super-dreadnoughts—warships of the Sovereign class—were destroyed by bombs of raiding Zeppelins, is a statement made today in the Fatherland, a German weekly published here.
