**THERMIT USED TO WELD  
 FIVE-TON CRANK SHAFT**

One of Biggest Jobs of Machine Work  
 Ever Done Here—4,000 De-  
 grees of Heat.

One of the biggest jobs of machine  
 work ever done in Washington was  
 undertaken yesterday by the Allen &  
 Mitchell Co. It was the welding of a  
 broken crankshaft which weighed 5  
 tons and belongs in a station in Wash-  
 ington.

The broken shaft was first repaired  
 in a form after the broken ends had  
 been trimmed off and a sand mold  
 poured about it. Next the broken  
 parts were placed in the mold and  
 then the shaft was again heated  
 by means of gasolene and a  
 torch.

Having attained the heat, the  
 operation called Thermit consisted of  
 iron filings and aluminum being  
 held in a crucible above the spot  
 was set off and a half minute later  
 poured into the mold.

The broken shaft was then  
 the broken parts and the new  
 metal at the time of pouring was 4,000  
 degrees. It is thought it is doubtful  
 if the metal has almost reached its  
 original strength.

 Progressive Republicans, and they in-  
 vened the measure. Senator Simmons  
 denied that there was an agreement be-  
 tween Republicans and Democrats to  
 push aside consideration of the bill.

**LIQUOR DEALERS FROM  
 VIRGINIA NOT WELCOME**

In granting a transfer on the license of  
 Martin McDonald, of 1200 1/2 street  
 northwest, yesterday, the Excise Board  
 made it plain that it does not pro-  
 pose to welcome "carpet-bagger"  
 liquor dealers from Virginia.

The board consented to the addition of  
 George W. Hodge to the McDonald  
 license. Hodge was formerly a liquor  
 dealer at Newport News, Va.

Virginia goes dry within a few  
 weeks, and the Excise Board stated  
 that in consenting to the transfer yester-  
 day it must not be regarded as a pre-  
 cedent for other Virginia dealers to  
 come here for locations after non-  
 license goes into effect in their own  
 State.

**WILL INTRODUCE BILL  
 TO PAY CLERK'S FARE**

Before Congress adjourns the custom-  
 ary attempt to give the Capital employ-

Representative Van Dyke, of Minne-
