SHIPBUILDING ACTIVITY BLOCKS NAVAL WORK
 Demand for Merchant Vessels Taxes Yards to Capacity.
 With American shipyards taxing their capacity to build merchant ships to an extent never known before, Navy Department officials yesterday began a survey of the shipbuilding situation, to determine where the great naval construction program, authorized by the last session of Congress, is to be laid down. Government officials, in touch with the shipbuilding situation, declare that at present, and for the next two years, there will not be available building space to take care of the sixty-six vessels which the navy plans to begin work on as soon as possible.
 Navy Department officials said, however, that despite the pressure of private business, several of the big shipbuilding plants, notably the Cramp Shipbuilding Company and the Newport News Shipbuilding Company have reserved space in their yards to accommodate battle-ships, if they can secure contracts. The Navy Department believes that these yards, with the government navy yards, will be able to take care of the capital ships authorized for this year. But the scores of smaller vessels and auxiliary craft which must be constructed will probably be long delayed because of the pressure of merchant construction.

G. W. U. ARTILLERISTS ENCAPMED NEAR CITY

Organization on Outing at Congress Heights Rifle Range.

The Coast Artillery, N. G. D. C., is encamped at the National Guard Rifle Range near Congress Heights, D. C. Forty-five members of the organization, composed of students and former students of George Washington University, went to the camp last Wednesday and will stay there until Tuesday. The day before they made camp near rifle, pistols, and tentage were issued to them. Their work has included making camp and preparing meals. Rifle work has been over distances of 300, 400 and 600 yards. Practices will be given in the use of automatic pistols. Capt. W. W. Burns, in charge of the camp, Lieut. C. Baxter and Howard W. Hodgkins are also in the camp. Capt. A. C. Compton, Coast Artillery, U. S. A., is with the militia.

U. S. OFFICIALS PROBE SHELL PLANT STATUS

Reports that the Anglo-Russian commission, which has last year in all purchases for the entire allies in this country, has acquired stock control of the Eddystone Ammunition Company of Philadelphia, and will manufacture ammunition there, are being investigated by the State Department. Secretary Lansing admitted this yesterday and also said that it was possible that, if the report be true, charges of violating neutrality might be involved. The corporation was organized five years ago to manufacture shells for the Russian government, and according to a statement attributed to Alva B. Johnson, president of the Baldwin Locomotive Works, the Anglo-Russian commission took over the property recently and is about to designate directors to run it.
