

FOOD CARDS HAMPER GERMAN WOLE PLANS

Berlin Retailers Petition for Relaxation of Regulations.

Berlin, Sept. 25.—The greater Berlin association of retail dealers in clothing, haberdashery, textiles, etc., has again petitioned the imperial chancellor to so alter the present system for the purchase of their supplies between November 1 and December 24 as to enable the public to do its ordinary Christmas shopping, which apparently is going to be difficult.

The retailers also complain in their petition of the injustice of the present system, by which goods on hand before the card system went into effect must be sold at the old price and goods procured afterward at a higher price.

ARMED WOMAN WARRIOR FOLLOWED BY SAVAGES

Cape Town, Sept. 25.—There has appeared in the Killmarjano region a German woman warrior who is leading a force of armed troops without the assistance of any other Europeans.

Among the fighting forces and residents in British East Africa this white Amazon is known as the Bibi Sacharini, a name which has been given her by the natives.

The native story is that she is the wife of a German commandant who was killed in the fight which took place at Longido, on September 25, 1914. She was so grief-stricken over the death of her husband that she had openly declared to be revengeful.

She is described as a big woman with flaxen hair. She rides astride and is armed to the teeth. She seems to have a wonderful control over her native followers.

CROSSES CONTINENT TO HARVARD AS HOBO

Varnum, 21, who is to enter this year's freshman class at Harvard, arrived in Boston today from Oakland, Cal., having covered the transcontinental trip by blind baggage and on engine tenders in 9 days, 13 hours and 13 minutes. The trip cost him \$10, more than half of which was spent to obtain his release from a jail in Sandusky, Ohio, where he spent two days, until the necessary money was forwarded by friends to pay his fine and the costs.

Varnum had a handful of friends good-by at Oakland September 13, as he boarded a blind baggage. He repeatedly was thrown off trains, being given a lift in only one instance, when a train crew in the West gave him an opportunity to work for his transportation.

His parents are wealthy ranch owners in Idaho.

TWO SISTERS REUNITED AFTER THIRTY YEARS

SETS SELF AFLAME IN SUICIDE ATTEMPT

Lehigh street, swallowed part of the contents of a quart bottle of turpentine, saturated his clothes with the remainder and then set fire to his clothes. He is in Roosevelt Hospital in a serious condition, burned about the head and body. Waterman had been ill for several months, and his wife believes that his mind became affected. After saturating his clothing with turpentine he used a kerosene lamp to set himself on fire. His wife, who was in an adjoining room, heard him and ran to his rescue. Her hands were severely burned when she tried to beat out the flames. She slipped, and a policeman came in and helped to extinguish the flames.

GONZAGA HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT SWELLED
