
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DEATH CLAIMS WIDOW OF JUSTICE HARLAN

Mrs. John Marshall Harlan, widow of Associate Justice Harlan of the Supreme Court of the United States, died last night at her residence, 1833 M street northwest.

Mrs. Harlan was injured in a fall at her summer home on Murray Bay, Quebec province, Canada, and was brought to Washington Monday, and died last night as a result of her injuries.

Before her marriage to Justice Harlan she was Miss Malvina Shanklin.

Arrangements for the funeral have not been made. Interment will be in Rock Creek cemetery, where Justice Harlan is buried.

TWO MEN AND DOG HURT IN LEAP TO AVOID FIRE

Fire discovered early yesterday in the rooming house of James Buckley, 324 Pennsylvania avenue northwest, formerly known as the Hartford House, did \$1,200 damage and caused injuries to two roomers who were forced to jump from windows.

John T. Gormley, 50 years old, and William C. Scollick, 40 years old, were the victims. They received slight injuries to their legs and feet in jumping from the third and second floors to an adjoining roof.

The fire was discovered by Private J. A. Beckett, of the Sixth precinct, who saw smoke coming out of the building, which is located in the heart of Chinatown. A dog jumped from a window and broke its leg.

About \$1,000 damage was done the building, for which Edward P. Walsh is agent. Buckley's loss was about \$200.
