

CRUCIBLE STEEL SINKS EARNINGS INTO PLANT

Action Proves Disappointing to Speculators, but Will Benefit Issue.

Special to The Washington Herald. New York, Nov. 9.—One reason why Crucible Steel has not made more response to its earnings is indicated in the company's balance sheet for the year. By this it appears that \$15,000,000 was appropriated out of profits for new construction and for working capital, bringing the item down to \$4,542,000 as against \$10,465,000 on August 31, 1915. This, of course, from an investment standpoint is no argument against the stock.

FIND SKULL FOR WHICH MEXICO OFFERED \$4,000

Discovery Recalls History of Pasquale Bolano, Daring Bandit.

Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 9.—Recalling the lawless days of early California history, when Pasquale Bolano, daring Mexican bandit, ravaged with a brutal impartiality the ranches on both sides of the international boundary, a fast crumpling skull, said to be that of the man on whose head the Mexican government once placed a price of \$4,000, was unearthed in a dusty corner of an old adobe building in El Centro today.

W. J. MURRAY STRICKEN ON STREET AND DIES

While walking in Girard street northwest, in company with his wife, William J. Murray, formerly of Forsberg & Murray, machinists, in Girard street, was fatally stricken with heart failure yesterday afternoon. His body was taken to the home of Frank T. Mitchell, his stepson, 147 Girard street, and later removed to the Murray residence at 134 Buchanan street northwest. Coroner Nevitt issued a certificate of death.

Laredo, Tex., Nov. 9.—Gen. Fortunato Maycotte, commander of a Carranza force, is among those killed in the battle with Villistas south of Parral, according to refugees arriving at Laredo from Monterey. The casualties on both sides were heavy.

BRITAIN CUTS LIMIT OF PAPER IMPORTED

Supplementary Regulations Are Made Known by Consul General.

Consul General Robert P. Skinner, of London, reports the following supplementary regulations regarding the restriction of British imports of paper issued by the Royal Commission on Paper: "In order to give effect to the decision of his majesty's government that the imports of paper must now be reduced by one-half, instead of by one-third as heretofore, the licenses issued by the commission for importations in respect of the supply allowed for the four months November, 1915, to February, 1917, will be reduced, so that the allowance for that period will be one-fourth less than it would have been if the reduction had remained at one-third.
