## ALEXANDRIA COUNTY TAX ON \$11,402,069

Assessment of Realty, Personal Property and Utilities Completed.

Alexandria, Va., Dec. 16.—According to the assessment completed in Alexandria County by Commissioner of Revenue William H. Duncan the total assessed value on all property is \$11,402,069. The assessment on public service corporations is \$1,564,411 and on all real estate \$7,563,190, or a total on real estate and public service corporations of \$9,127,601.

The assessment on personal property is as follows: On all tangible personal property, \$357,630; money on deposit, \$12,751; bonds, notes, etc., \$231,450; shares of stock, \$500,440; personal estates in hands of fiduciaries, etc., \$304,012; capital of joint incorporated stock companies, \$217,230; bank stock, (paid in as of February 1, 1915), \$4,085; total income, \$282,530; total assessed value on all personal property, \$2,091,462.

There are 3,120 male citizens of age assessed and 300 State revenue licenses were issued during the year.

## AMERICAN PAINTINGS ATTRACT THOUSANDS

Corcoran Art Gallery Opens Sixth Exhibition of Oil Canvases.

Artists, connoisseurs and other art lovers thronged the Corcoran Gallery of Art last night at the formal opening of the sixth exhibition of oil paintings by contemporary American artists. Last night's exhibition, like its predecessors, was held to recognize the just claim that American art ranks with the best contemporary art of the world and for the purpose of encouraging its development. Generous and unstinted cooperation of American artists and art patrons contributed essentially to last night's successful exhibition. Enthusiastic interest was manifested on every side and the thousand and odd visitors unstintedly praised the exhibited works.

Charles C. Glover, president and treasurer; William Corcoran Eustis, vice president; C. Powell Miningerode, secretary and director; and Thomas Hyde, John M. Wilson, William A. Clarke, Henry White, George E. Hamilton, and James Parmelee, of the board of trustees, were in the receiving line.

Center points of admiration were the four prize paintings. The first prize and the Corcoran gold medal were awarded to Arthur B. Davies on his exhibit, "Castalia." Ernest Lawson's exhibit, "Boathouse: Winter—Harlem River," merited the second prize and the Corcoran silver medal. "Nude, with Still Life," the work of Hugh H. Breckenridge, was awarded third prize and the Corcoran bronze medal. The fourth prize and the Corcoran honorable mention certificate were awarded George B. Luke on his exhibit, "Woman and Macaws." The prizes were donated by William A. Clarke.

An orchestral program was given.
