civilized states have agreed. If it did not suit its interests. "Upon that principle little Serbia was served with an ultimatum that demanded the surrender of her independence, and upon her failure to comply to the uttermost she was overwhelmed. Upon that principle little Belgium that had no quarrel with anybody, was served with a demand that she surrender her independence, rights as a neutral and violate her solemn agreements to preserve her neutrality. And upon her refusal to surrender her rights and violate her faith, she was overwhelmed, and that principle is still maintained and asserted to be right.

Upholds Monroe Doctrine. "We stand here with the Monroe doctrine against the push and sweep of that mighty world tendency of national evolution to progress under the principle that neither faith of treaties nor obligation of law nor rule of morality should stand in the way of a state that finds it to its interest to take what it wants for time; that in the family of nations, America is a female.

"Suppose the result of this war is such that these foreign influences that have helped preserve the Monroe doctrine disappear. For we are not ready to defend it," he asked. The Monroe doctrine will be worthless. What will it mean if a foreign naval power, a real naval power, a real military power, obtains a naval base in the Caribbean, or in those islands of the Pacific off Panama? Our interest in the Panama Canal will be as worthless to us as the Bosphorus is to Russia today.

"And instead of having what we have spent about four hundred million to accomplish, the means of transferring our navy from ocean to ocean, our navy will be shut up again on one side or the other of the continent. And then we will have to live as poor peaceable France has lived for the last forty years with a sentinel always on the lookout for an approaching foe. Then the fancied security and sweet, comfortable ease of our people will be replaced by alarms and rumors of war and attack upon occasion. For the Monroe doctrine was based upon sound wisdom, and the abandonment of it or the destruction of it will be the end of our security."

Thayer, of Harvard, Speaks.

President Wilson yesterday called upon Secretary of the Treasury McAdoo at the latter's office in the Treasury Building, this being the first occasion on which the Chief Executive has paid his son-in-law a visit at his own office.

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AMERICA LIKE A WOMAN, ASSERTS ADMIRAL FISKE

disappeared altogether, after the call came. Over 2,000 of these were found physically unfit.

REAR ADMIRAL BRADLEY A. FISKE FOLLOWED MR. STIMSON AND TALKED ON "NAVAL POWER."

Admiral Fiske said in part: "Every intelligent man and woman in Europe, Asia and Africa knows that America can exert great moral and economic force in the world, but very little physical force.

"This means that America's position is sustained by two forces only, though the position of every other great power is sustained by three forces; it means that America lacks that special kind of national force that has always been the most essential to nations; it means that America is like a woman, because she depends for her safety on the absence of physical danger or on the strong right arms of others; it means that America's attitude is feminine not masculine; that in the family of nations, America is a female.

"When the nations now fighting cease to fight, and make terms of peace together, what will those terms include? America will be tempting and helpless before the first move of a conqueror. "Into what form shall we put the available power we need? There is only one form in which it will effectually serve us—the navy. The navy is the only great kinetic power America possesses; the only concentrated, directly available power; the only thing on which the standing of America as a world power can be securely based."

MEYER MAKES STRONG PLEA FOR EXPANSION OF NAVY

George von L. Meyer, former Secretary of the Navy, was the last speaker of the evening and spoke of the advantages of a large navy.

"We must bear in mind," he said, "that the Monroe doctrine is as strong as the fleet and no stronger.

"Now, in addition to supporting and enforcing our policies, what would be the primary use of our navy? It would be to prevent blockades. "Take New England, how long would it be before the mills would be shut down, if coal could not be transported here by sea—and what would be the condition of this country if its commerce, amounting to over 4,000,000,000 were paralyzed, as is the case in Germany?"

"A coalition between two countries, one on the Pacific and the other on the Atlantic, would be the simplest method to force us to grant their conditions, and secure indemnities which would refund their entire war expenses.

"Our position with reference to the Panama Canal, the shipping lanes of England to the channel, and that of the Mediterranean countries to the Suez Canal. "This has been a masterful stroke and without its accomplishment, Germany would probably have won out in this war before now. Therefore, no matter what the British navy cost, it has proved to be a good investment, as well as an insurance for the English people and the institutions.
