### Griffmen Take Final Game From Connie Mack's Clan

Nationals' First Sacker, Joe Judge, Sends Out Triple With Bases Filled.

Many decades ago a wiseacre penned something about a worm turning. If he had lived during these hours of trials and tribulations and been a spectator at the final combat between the Nationals and Athletics at the Florida avenue ballpark yesterday afternoon, he would have perhaps more fully appreciated the broader meaning of this adage.

At present it refers to the home folks, or if one wishes to single out an individual, Joe Judge. The latter, who first made his name as a pitcher for the Nationals, was the first to get the Nationals' bats going yesterday afternoon, thus putting the Nationals far in the van and giving them revenge for the previous day's defeat.

Judge's blow came in round two with a tie score, and ended all argument as to who was to emerge through the small end of the horn. The Nationals triumphed because they hammered the very life out of pitcher Myers, the starting pitcher in the opening inning, but the Nationals came right back and evened the count in their half. Then came the second—the demise of Myers and a Washington victory.

Judge started the Nationals' portion with a hit, posturing himself for a grand slam with a sacrifice, and on Milan's single Judge took third. Schang threw badly to catch Milan stealing and Judge scored.
