

**ALL READY FOR GUARD
RALLY AT B. F. KEITH'S**

Leading Citizens of Washington to Appeal for Recruits.

Plans have been completed for the big military rally at Keith's Theater at noon today, when appeals for enlistments in the District National Guard will be made from the stage by Col. Richard D. Simms of the Military Service Legion; District Commissioner Brownlow, Rev. Dr. J. C. Gordon, and Brig. Gen. William E. Harvey, commanding the District Guard. Col. Simms will preside.

By reason of discharges and failure of its men to come up to physical standard, the Third Regiment of the District Guard has been greatly depleted and yesterday only one recruit was received through the ordinary enlistment channels.

The meeting today, which will be held under the auspices of the Military Service Legion, will be brief, but the speeches will be stirring and to the point. A feature of the program will be bugle calls and marches by the buglers of the Third Regiment. There also will be a machine gun exhibit in the lobby.

In order to handle the recruits who are expected to enlist a detail of recruiting officers has been stationed in Keith's lobby. The teachers there will be several automobiles to take the applicants to Fort Myer for physical examinations. Music will be furnished by the Marine Band. Buglers and drummers from Fort Myer will be stationed on the outside of the theater.
