



MARSHAL'S MAP SHOWS BARRED LIEN ZONES

United States Marshal Maurice Spain yesterday received a large map of the District showing the territory for which enemy aliens will be prohibited after June 1. Aliens living within half a mile of the navy yard, Barron, Army War College, Fifth-Sterling, Steel Plant, or the United States magazines on the Potomac shore just south of the steel plant, must change their place of residence within this month or apply for a permit, if they wish to continue to reside in the restricted zone...

YEAR'S WAR BUDGET BEFORE HOUSE TODAY

After a debate attended by patriotic speeches relating to the unity of the country in prosecuting the war with Germany, the House completed consideration yesterday of the big war budget appropriation of more than 2,500,000,000 for the first year of the war. The roll call on the bill, which probably will be unanimous, will be taken today. The House added an amendment to the bill providing the money to pay the increased pay for enlisted men of the army, as authorized in the war bill which passed Congress Saturday. This bill, for raising a million men, increases the pay of enlisted men during the war from \$15 to \$20 per month. As amended the war budget carries a total of approximately \$1,800,000,000.

President Issues Order For Telegraph Censorship. Actual war censorship went into effect yesterday. Acting under an executive order issued by President Wilson, the War Department took over yesterday morning, control of all telegraph and telephone lines. At the same time the Navy Department assumed charge of the cables. As a result of this action, hereafter only messages which actually have passed the censor will be transmitted. The President's order says that all companies or other persons owning, controlling or operating telegraph and telephone lines or submarine cables, are prohibited from transmitting messages to points without the United States and from delivering messages received from such points.
