

BRITISH LABOR LEADERS HERE FOR CONFERENCE

Ally Mistake to Be Pointed Out to Guide Workers' Part in War.

Three distinguished members of the British Parliament, spokesmen of organized labor in the British empire, arrived in Washington yesterday to discuss with American labor leaders and national defense chiefs, the part American labor must play in winning the war.

The visiting delegates, named by Premier David Lloyd George, at the suggestion of Samuel Gompers, chairman of the labor committee of the advisory board of the Council of National Defense are: Charles W. Bowdoin, secretary of the British trade unions; James B. Thomas, representing the British engineers' brotherhood, and H. W. Goswell, of the British munitions board.
