ENLISTMENTS SHOW NATION-WIDE GAIN

Recruits Flock to National Guard Rather Than Be Drafted.

A nation-wide gain in enlistments in the National Guard was reported to the War Department yesterday. Thousands of young men are volunteering rather than be drafted under the conscription law. During the first ten days of June 13,976 recruits were gained.

With two weeks to go the regular army is still short 6,000 men war strength. Officials hope to raise the regulars to battle strength by the end of June. On Flag Day 170,000 recruits joined the service, the largest number, 17, being from New York. Pennsylvania has 112 and Illinois 100. The navy last night had 115,177 members and an average of 700 a day was coming in. The full strength of 150,000 will be reached within a few weeks, it is believed.
