DEMAND FOR HOMES TO BOOM BUILDING

Realty Operators to Meet Needs for Housing.

War activities and campaigns for funds had little effect on the Washington real estate market. Transactions closed last week were in number those of corresponding weeks of 1916 and 1915 and equal the record established in 1914.

Demand for apartments and homes surpasses the supply. As a result, hotels are taxed to capacity. It is expected that realty operators will take advantage of the situation and commence extensive building operations to meet the demand.

Brokers report a total of 157 transactions closed during the past six days involving 237 pieces of realty. Besides this more than \$1,000,000 was loaned on local real estate during the period.

New 4 per cent bonds for the amount of \$1,000,000 were issued during the week by the Interstate Building Corporation. These securities mature April 1, 1922.

Among the large purchases of the week was that of the Southern Building at Fifteenth and H streets, by the Southern Realty Corporation for \$1,500,000. The First National Fire Insurance Company made the transfer subject to a mortgage of \$900,000. The new owner, the second trust of \$650,000 on the land.

One of the largest residential propositions was made when Hamilton Smith, of Atlanta, purchased a handsome house at Sixteenth and residence. Purchase price was \$50,000.

Among the leases was that of Rudolph Kauffmann's summer home, Airlee, to E. W. Scripps, newspaper magnate, of San Francisco. The Navy Department announced yesterday that it would take several floors of the \$3,000,000 eleven-story building to be erected on the old Arlington Hotel site, Vermont avenue, H, and I streets.

Fifty small living houses are to be erected in the 9th block of G street. Eighteen are already under way and some are near completion. The operation takes in both sides of G street, east of Georgia avenue, and is expected to cost about \$200,000.

The majority of the loans placed during the past week were for 4 per cent. The total amount reached \$1,275,250, and the security offered consisted of 230 lots.

LECTURES ON FRANCE TO BEGIN NEXT WEEK

Talks On Buildings of France and Belgium at G. W. U.

A series of twelve illustrated lectures on "The Castles, Cathedrals, and Civic Buildings of France and Belgium" will be given this season at the George Washington University Summer School by Dr. Victor Horta, dean of the Royal School of Fine Arts at Brussels and professor of the University of Brussels. The lectures will be given on Wednesday and Friday beginning June 27, in the Arts and Sciences Department building, 305 G street northwest, and will be free to the public. By registering for the course and meeting certain additional requirements one semester-hour of credit may be earned.

Prof. Horta has been appointed Belgium Scholarship Professor of Architecture in George Washington University and will give a course during the season of 1917-1918 on "The Theory and Practice of Architectural Composition."

Miss Glasgow, of the Nurses' Training School of the university, will repeat her course of fifteen lectures on "Elementary Hygiene and Nurse Care of the Sick for Voluntary Aid Societies" during the season of the Summer School if a minimum of fifteen students elect to take it, beginning June 27.

The Arts and Sciences branch of the summer school will open on June 25 and continue through June 26. Courses in the Medical branch of the Summer School have just begun and will continue for approximately six weeks. The Law branch of the Summer School will open June 25 and continue through August 1.

This will be the second session of the George Washington University Summer School. Despite the war, it has much larger attendance than that recorded last summer is assured, due largely to the great influx of ex-government clerks to meet war-time requirements of the government.

Money Lack Hampers Strike Settlement

The Department of Labor which has had extraordinary success recently in settling strikes and disputes, announced yesterday its activities were being hampered by lack of funds.

"Requests for the most effective of the department in settlement of strikes in various lines of war industries which both affect war preparation are continually pouring in," the department statement declared. "In response to many of these requests the Department is obliged to report its inability to assist, owing to lack of funds. In so far as possible, however, it is meeting the situation by detailing employees in other lines of work to the conciliation work."
